New Helipad Opens at Thomas Memorial Hospital

In December 2022, leaders from HealthNet Aeromedical Services joined officials from WVU Medicine and the City of South Charleston, West Virginia to celebrate the opening of a new helipad at Thomas Memorial Hospital.

The helipad is enhancing the hospital's ability to care for critically ill patients, better serving area communities. The helipad is located along Division Street, just a short distance from the Emergency Department entrance.

The opening of the helipad came just after the announcement that the hospital will nearly double the number of intensive care unit beds at the facility. Both projects come at a time when there is a significant need in the region for more critical care beds, as local hospital ICUs are full, and patients are having to leave the area to receive critical care.

that made such a difference in patients' lives. I just knew that's where I needed to next take my career." Rebekah said.


In 2016, she graduated from nursing school. She started working in the ER at CAMC General Hospital in Charleston, West Virginia.
